On the recommendation of Kim Evans, on behalf of various county departments, Linda Kizzire moved to **renew the negotiated contract with Underground Vaults and Storage, Inc. at an estimated annual cost of \$40,000.00 per year for a total estimated five (5) year cost of \$200,000.00.** Tim Kaufman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Underground Vaults and Storage, Inc. is the only provider of these services in the region. Sedgwick County has utilized their services for over 50 years.

Costs are estimated based on the number of units in storage at the beginning of each quarter. There are units being added and removed constantly throughout the year. Last year the spend was around \$37,000.00.

Sedgwick County must adhere to the County Records Management Policy (Resolution #1-99) which implements portions of the Kansas Government Records Preservation Act (K.S.A. 45-401). These policies dictate how records are maintained, stored, retained, and destroyed.

On the recommendation of Kim Evans, on behalf of the Sheriff's Office, Tim Kaufman moved to **accept the quote from Insight Public Sector in the amount of \$53,830.00.** Linda Kizzire seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The iRecord system is an audio and video recording system the Sheriff's Office will utilize to record and document interviews and interrogations. The system allows the proper recording, transfer and storage of this critical information. It further allows detectives to label, bookmark, enter notes, and conduct searches of this data while using their individual computers.

This will be the fourth video system the Sheriff's Office has had over the preceding ten years. The county has put this type of system out for bid in the past and has been unsuccessful in obtaining an adequate solution. This system is already being used in the Exploited and Missing Child Unit (EMCU) and has been used on a trial basis for the past several months at Investigations.

Note -- U.S. Communities is a cooperative purchasing program that competitively bids contracts using a lead agency and makes them available for use by education, government and nonprofit sectors.

Question: Is this solution in addition to any current system(s) being used? Keith Allen from the Sheriff's Office indicated that the system currently in place has been failing for some time and that this system will be a full replacement that will meet all of their needs.

On the recommendation of Joe Thomas, on behalf of Risk Management, Linda Kizzire moved to **accept the insurance premium renewals as listed for an estimated total cost of \$678,482.00.** Tim Kaufman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

In general, the insurance market has not been profitable for the last year or so which has caused the market to increase rates and premiums. The county insurance agent has done an excellent job in negotiating a renewal that holds the line on premiums.

Risk Management recommends continuation of property insurance for the county with Alliant and its PEP (Public Entity Property Insurance Program). This program is not licensed in the State of Kansas so a non-admitted fee must be paid. The fee is included in the premiums shown. The renewal for all other insurance coverage is recommended with the incumbent insurance companies as shown in the table. The Professional Liability carrier for the doctors has declared a dividend that is payable to the doctors based on their experience and years insured.

The total amount of this dividend is \$4,000.00, which will return to the County. Excess Workers' Compensation changes: 1.5% decrease in estimated annual payroll, 7.96% increase in rate, and an overall premium increase 6.97%.
