Wichita, Kansas – A Wichita general contractor has entered into a consent judgment with the Office of the District Attorney involving allegations of unfair and deceptive acts and practices involving "door-to-door sales".

The District Attorney's Consumer Protection Division negotiated an agreement with Steven L. Coleman, d/b/a Construction Concepts & Investments. Mr. Coleman will pay \$5,500 to consumers along with court costs and investigative fees.

Mr. Coleman failed to provide a consumer with a notice, commonly referred to as the "Three Day Right to Cancel." The Kansas Consumer Protection Act requires businesses that offer services outside their place of business to provide customers with that right to cancel orally and in writing. The District Attorney's Office also alleged Mr. Coleman had violated a previous order by accepting money up front from a consumer, prior to paying the judgment in 2004CV4176, and engaging in unfair and deceptive acts or practices.

When the consent judgment was filed in District Court on May 18, 2017, Steven L. Coleman, d/b/a Construction Concepts & Investments, agreed to refrain from deceptive or unconscionable acts or practices.
