Wichita, Kansas - A former Goddard contractor on probation for contracting fraud was sentenced to 30 days in jail after admitting to a Sedgwick County judge that he had taken money for a landscaping project in south Wichita.

Jeff Vap, 51, was already serving probation for seven counts of felony theft related to construction fraud. He was booked into the Sedgwick County Jail on Wednesday (Dec. 2) following the hearing before Judge Ben Burgess.

As part of the hearing, Vap reimbursed \$1,500 to the Wichita homeowner for work that was never completed on the landscaping in front of her home.

Vap had previously lost his contracting license as a result of his felony convictions in Sedgwick County. Vap had been ordered not to work as an independent contractor while on probation.

Vap told Judge Burgess that he was going into the restaurant business.
