Wichita - Wednesday afternoon District Court Judge Jeffrey Goering sentenced Boe Adams, 28 of Wichita, to life with parole eligibility after 50 years for the stabbing death of Otto Meyer of Wichita. On April 28th of this year, the 86 year old man was found murdered in a house in the 800 block of N. Chautauqua. Mr. Meyer was showing a rental property he owned to Adams and a woman who was with Adams.

Wichita Police found the victim's truck parked at an apartment complex in Wichita. Adams and the woman were apprehended at a check cashing business, attempting to cash a check drawn on the account of Mr. Meyer.

Adams pled guilty as charged in June to first degree murder, aggravated robbery, theft and forgery. On Wednesday, Judge Goering ordered the sentence to run consecutive to any sentence imposed on the defendant from the State of Iowa in an unrelated case. Adams will be released to the State of Iowa to finish that sentence before he begins his prison time in Kansas.

Adams co-defendant, Yvonne Mosqueda, 19 of Wichita, is scheduled for a preliminary hearing September 20th on charges of first degree murder, aggravated robbery and theft.
