Wichita, Kansas – This morning, State v. Cundiff was dismissed "without prejudice," meaning the case can be refiled at a later date. This case involved participants in a business venture and the alleged unauthorized transfer of business funds. The decision to dismiss was driven by several factors. First, all cases continue to be evaluated and scrutinized even after they are filed. Second, in the last several days, a significant sum of the contested funds were returned to the owner/victim. Third, the defendant's lack of criminal history and the fact that any disposition through the criminal court would have carried a presumptive probation disposition also influenced the out-of-state victim's request that the office of the District Attorney dismiss the criminal matter.

As always, any accused defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
