Wichita, Kansas - A man with 92 criminal convictions and adjudications has been sentenced in Sedgwick County District Court. On January 15, Judge Kevin O'Connor sentenced David Osborne, 47 of Wichita, to 37 months in prison. On September 28, 2015, Osborne pled guilty to 11 counts of identity theft, forgery, theft and possession of methamphetamine.

Osborne's previous criminal cases began in 1982 with theft. Some of the numerous criminal cases against him involve criminal damage to property, fleeing and eluding police, aggravated battery and conspiracy to commit forgery. The convictions come from incidents that occurred in Wichita, Haysville, Hutchinson, Great Bend, El Dorado and Newton.

Osborne's current case began when a Wichita Police Officer was dispatched to a forgery report at Casey's General Store, 3540 S. Meridian, on May 9, 2014. The officer arrived before Osborne could leave. After investigating both Osborne's identity and a subsequent search of the car he was in, numerous items related to the manufacturing of identification cards and several people's personal identifiers were located. The officer had prior experience as a Consumer Protection and Financial Crimes Investigator.
