WICHITA, KAN. — A woman charged with multiple crimes including mail theft, identity theft, criminal use of financial cards and burglary has been sentenced in Sedgwick County District Court. Stacy Cole, 41 of Wichita, was sentenced to 24 months probation with an underlying sentence of 111 months by Judge David Kaufman.

In one of the six criminal cases filed against Cole, Wichita Police found her with stolen credit cards issued by Discover, Visa, Sam's Club, Dress Barn and AAA. Cole pled guilty to a total of 24 crimes including identity theft for using credit cards stolen from mailboxes and cars parked at local retailers.

In the plea agreement, Cole is no longer permitted to enter or be on the property of any Target or Walmart Store in the United States. If she is found on the premises of any of the stores, the plea agreement reads, "She can be arrested for trespassing or be subject to further prosecution." The ban continues after probation/prison ends and shall remain in effect indefinitely.

On August 14th, Judge Kaufman also ordered Cole to pay \$22,907.28 in restitution.
