WICHITA, KAN. – A man has been sentenced for committing a burglary in a west Wichita house. During the burglary, Shane Beeves, 45 of Wichita, was stabbed by an occupant of the home.

District Judge Terry Pullman sentenced Beeves to 89 months in prison on charges of aggravated burglary, attempted aggravated robbery, theft and other crimes.

Beeves (pronounced BEE'-vuhs) was found guilty of entering the home on N. Cardington on January 19, 2015, where he was confronted by a 17-year-old male. Beeves was stabbed in the shoulder five times, the side three times and at least once in the head. The 17-year-old was home with his mother and 13-year-old brother at the time of the burglary. Beeves was armed with the pry bar he used to burglarize the house. After he was stabbed, Beeves ran from the house, stole an SUV from a construction yard and was later arrested after a chase with Wichita Police.

At the time of his arrest, Beeves was on parole for burglary. Friday morning Beeves apologized to the family. Judge Pullman denied a request for probation.
