Exterior – Pedestrian Paths of Travel	Designated accessible parking spaces fully comply with ADAAG, however parking is located across street and curb ramps on the path of travel from parking to the facility entrance have steep running slopes, steep side flares, inappropriate detectable warnings, and have narrow widths.	4.7.7 4.3.7	Since these curb ramps lead to a cross vehicular traffic way, the necessity of detectable warning surface is magnified. The existing curb cut has a detectable warning surface. However, this detectable warning does not comply with current ADAAG specifications regarding truncated domes. According to ADAAG, nowhere shall the cross slope of an accessible route exceed 1:50. ADAAG requires side flares on curb ramps to be a maximum slope of 1:10. The running slopes of curb ramps are required to be no steeper than 1:12 (8.33%). The running slope of the existing curb ramp measures over 12%. The curb ramp surface must be at least 36-inches wide. Modify curb ramps on the path of travel to Fleet Management to comply with ADAAG specifications or create an accessible parking space at the facility where curb ramps are not part of the required pedestrian path of travel. Accessible counters are a maximum of 36-inches high and a minimum of 36-inches long. Ensure that a desk in close proximity to the counter is available and can be utilized when necessary.
