Courtrooms in the New Courthouse need their own communications policy based on guidance from Title II and the Proposed Final Rule - Judicial, Legislative, and Regulatory Facilities.
Some public rooms and spaces have visual alarms and some do not. According to ADAAG, if visual alarms exist, then they must exist in all rooms and spaces, such as restrooms, jury rooms, courtrooms, etc.
