1. Parking	The curb ramp leading from the accessible parking access aisle has a steep cross slope.	4.3.7	According to ADAAG, nowhere shall the cross slope of an accessible route exceed 1:50. At the existing curb ramp, since a turn is required at the top to follow the path of travel, a steep cross slope exists on the path of travel. Modify the curb ramp so that a level landing exists by creating a sidewalk cut level with the parking surface or other means to ensure a steep cross does not exist on the pedestrian path of travel. 2. Parking	The existing signage, which designates accessible parking spaces, is located too low.	4.1.2( 5)(b) 4.6.4	ADAAG requires accessible parking spaces to be located in each parking lot. Accessible parking spaces are required to have upright signage that includes the symbol of accessibility and van accessible signage where required. Such signs are required to be located so they can be seen with a vehicle parked in the space. This requirement can generally be adhered to with the sign mounted at 5-feet high measured to the bottom of the lowest sign. Provide upright signage in front of each existing accessible vehicle parking space, which complies with ADAAG specifications.
