WICHITA, KAN. – In the last two days, two men have been found guilty of first degree murder in the deaths of three people in Wichita.

On Thursday, a jury in Judge Jeff Syrios' courtroom returned a guilty verdict in the trial of Jamion Wimbley, 22 of Wichita. Wimbley was found guilty of two counts of first degree (felony) murder and two counts of criminal discharge of a firearm. On January 1st, 2015, Wimbley shot Brenton Oliver and Betty Ann Holloman in the front yard of a home in the 2500 block of E. Mossman.

Wimbley is scheduled to be sentenced January 25th. He is the last of four men tried and convicted in the double homicide. Quincy Carter and Brent Carter are serving life sentences. Johnathan Carter is awaiting sentencing on January 2nd.

This morning a jury in Judge Ben Burgess' courtroom found Keeshaun Milo, 29 of Wichita, guilty of first degree (felony) murder in the December 2, 2016 shooting of Michael Hamilton in the 3800 block of S. Meridian. Milo is scheduled to be sentenced on January 11th, 2019.
