On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of the Department of Corrections, Angela Caudillo moved to accept the proposals and execute service provider agreements with Tiyospaye, Inc. dba Higher Ground for \$100,000.00, Kansas Big Brothers Big Sisters for \$35,331.00, Center for Behavioral and Academic Research for \$145,686.00, The Pando Initiative, Inc. for \$66,784.00, and EmberHope, Inc. dba EmberHope Youthville for \$138,344.31. Tim Myers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

A committee consisting of Chris Collins-Thoman - Department of Corrections; Jeannette Livingston, Assistant Director - SCDDO; Delores Craig-Morland, Ph.D.- WSU consultant; and Britt Rosencutter - Purchasing evaluated all proposal responses based on the criteria set forth in the RFP. The committee agreed unanimously to accept the proposals as stated above.

The Sedgwick County Community Crime Prevention Fund utilizes current research to target grant dollars to achieve the greatest crime prevention impact and assist youth at risk of offending to improve the quality of their lives.

Sedgwick County is allocating approximately \$582,000.00 annually in support of prevention and early intervention programs targeted to youth at risk for juvenile delinquency.

#### Note

Kansas Legal Services withdrew their proposal and it was decided that Youth for Christ Wichita would not receive funding at this time.

## Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: Chris, could you please give us a brief overview for the record what these contracts are intended to accomplish?

Chris Collins-Thomas: In 2018, the crime prevention dollars under Sedgwick County were moved to the Department of Corrections but there was already a 3 year RFP in progress at that time so this will be the first year of us being responsible all the way through the RFP through contracts. The services we get, Higher Ground, target substance abuse treatment. Kansas Big Brothers Big Sisters is a new partner this cycle who will be doing mentoring. We have asked them to focus on the highest risk youth and hardest to match. They have agreed to 15 matches within 6 months so we can then hopefully see some outcomes from the last of the contract year.

The services through the Center for Behavioral and Academic Research is actually a gap service. We had put that out for RFP on the Sedgwick County KDOC grant site at one point. There weren't really any other service providers that were willing to take youth that were in short term suspension or expulsion from school. The school distract at that point does not have a service for them but this service provider will take those youth. He has an online training course he does with them for credits towards their high school diploma. He also does life skills and other cog-based services within that. We have had our WSU consultants working with them on implementing more evidence-based programming into their service, because again, it's not one that as a whole is evidenced-based. For our purpose and keeping our youth busy when they are suspended or expelled, this is a perfect match for us.

The Pando Initiative works in the middle schools targeting youths in the moderate to high risk range for potential to offend. They may not have offended yet. This year they will also be branching out to the Derby School District, which I know one of the commissioners is very interested in because most of the services have previously been in Wichita as opposed to the surrounding communities.

We have partnered with EmberHope for a number of years for functional family therapy. They did have some poor outcomes last year and we asked them to do a corrective action plan. They lost some of their referral base when the State of Kansas, Kansas Department of Corrections contracted with a different provider locally to provide those services. They do provide us a gap service for those youth who aren't in the custody of KDOC or receiving those services. Even though it looks like it's a large amount, the for-service profit in the national database shows that per cost they're still meeting that amount.

Russell Leeds: How many programs did we have in 2018?

Chris Collins-Thomas: We had 6 in 2018. What happened this time is one of our current providers, for whatever reason, said they didn't get the proposal that it was on the list to be sent out so we will have a little bit left over and plan to do another round with that overage to get another secondary prevention provider in place. We hope they will apply because again they target that middle school range of kids. The one that's missing is Mental Health Association is who we had funded in the last cycle.

## Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: Mike, can you give us a brief explanation on how this integrates with the product we already have?

Mike Elpers: Currently, all types of communication with candidates goes out via e-mail. When someone creates a profile on our jobsite, we automatically send them an e-mail that says thank you for visiting our site and looking over jobs. Same thing when someone actually applies for a job, we automatically send them an e-mail thanking them for their interest in the Sedgwick County position, your application has been received, mainly generic e-mail messages. This gives us the ability to not only communicate with those candidates via e-mail but also SMS Text though a text message. SMS Text is proven to have been more responsive and grabs their attention. They respond to it faster. It has a higher read rate. A lot of times when e-mails come in from generic e-mail addresses, they can be dismissed more easily by the consumer. There's even some e-mail programs out there that recognize an invalid e-mail address and will move it to a spam folder type thing. This is just proven to be a better way to communicate to potential employees, as well as, increase the speed of communication.

 $Tim\ Myers:\ Are\ they\ able\ to\ schedule\ their\ interviews,\ testing\ times,\ that\ kind\ of\ thing\ through\ the\ SMS\ Text\ also?$ 

Mike Elpers: Scheduling doesn't occur through that. There's a different functionality that does the scheduling. Communication about those upcoming appointments, interviews, and testing sessions can be made through the SMS Text as well as e-mail.

Randy Bargdill: Those kind of texts are going to be both from HR and the department?

Mike Elpers: They can be. It supports any kind of ad hoc kind of e-mail or text message from the hiring authorities.

Sedgwick County's dental program is a fully functioning, comprehensive dental office. Sedgwick County provides services for low-income, uninsured children ages 5-15, who do not qualify for state managed insurance and parents that meet the poverty guidelines. Volunteer dentists provide all restorative work and Wichita State University's Dental Hygiene students provide all preventive services.

Dental Health Products, Inc. was the previously awarded vendor. The county's 2018 spend with them was \$12,744.00.

# **Questions and Answers**

Angela Caudillo: What's the difference between the recommended and the next highest? I noticed some have higher prices and some have lower prices. It looks like on this list it's only showing one box, unit, or package would be. I wouldn't think you would use just 1 so maybe some you would use 20 and some you would use 2. How did we get to the low overall?

Joe Thomas: Since we're uncertain about the total pricing, we had to convert it to the unit pricing. We added the unit pricing together to get the cumulative total to see which one overall had the lower price. Each year fluctuates as to how much we use.

Susan Shelite: It can. It really depends on how many fillings we're doing versus how many extractions or how many cleanings were done.

Joe Thomas: The reason we went to overall low pricing for one vendor because managing 3 contracts with 3 vendors would be pretty problematic.

Susan Shelite: To be financially scrupulous, it would take so much time to go through this vendor, this vendor, and this vendor and then going to put it into the system and find that. It was just easier to go with one because this vendor was cheaper on this one thing but may have been higher on another. So by the end of it all, if it's one and the same by the time you go through each of the 3 vendors.

Angela Caudillo: Was there any weighing for if we're a little cheaper on this one but we use a bunch more of this?

Joe Thomas: It didn't really skew it. We did a couple configurations to come up with the overall low bidder. Plus the fact that Dental Health Products, Inc. was the incumbent and the department has had good success with it.

Susan Shelite: It also helps being with the same person too. They've done well for the program. They give us really great prices on a lot of things compared to people in our area. I feel it's fiscally responsible to stick with that vendor we've had before instead of changing to another one or trying to remember which vendor I'm supposed to buy what from. If there's 3 of them and we're such a small office to start with, it just makes life easier.

Angela Caudillo: From a number standpoint, is there any financial breakdown that we could look at and see what that difference would be for estimating?

Paul Regehr: I actually did a comparison based on estimated annual usage and Dental Health Products came out the cheapest.

Joe Thomas: So you used last year's numbers?

Paul Regehr: In quantities, yes.

Randy Bargdill: Has Sedgwick County ever done business with Darby Dental or Henry Schein before?

Susan Shelite: Not that I'm aware of but I'm very new to this position.

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Joe Thomas: How far back did Dental Health go?

Paul Regehr: I think it was 4 years.

Susan Shelite: I think maybe it was Goetze before then. I know that Dental Health Products is much less expensive than

Goetze's prices.

On the recommendation of Joe Thomas, on behalf of Human Resources, Tim Myers moved to accept the proposal from United HealthCare (self-funded) for a first year cost of \$711,568.80 and execute a three (3) year contract with two (2) one (1) year options to renew. Jennifer Dombaugh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Randy Bargdill abstaining.

A committee comprised of Karen Bailey - Chief Deputy Clerk; Randy Bargdill - Chief Deputy Treasurer; Tonya Buckingham - Register of Deeds; Adrienne Byrne - Health Department Director; Mike Elpers - ERP Director; Susan Erlenwein - Environmental Resources Director; Rusty Leeds - Assistant County Manager; Lindsay Poe-Rousseau - Chief Financial Officer; Heather Poorman Benefits Manager; Richard Powell - Undersheriff; Sheena Schmutz - Human Resources Director; Tom Stolz - County Manager; and Joe Thomas - Purchasing reviewed all responses, shortlisted and interviewed Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas, Inc., United HealthCare, and Aetna Life Insurance Company.

The committee unanimously agreed that United HealthCare (*self-funded model*) offers the best proposal for the county. The recommended carrier offers robust wellness and disease management programs supported through extensive technology based applications including mobile apps, web-based programs, wellness coaching, and extensive condition management options, which fully supports Sedgwick County's overall philosophy regarding employee health and accountability goals. United HealthCare offered a three (3) year rate cap on the administrative service costs for self-funding, as well as, offered extensive guarantees for operational, service, clinical, and network discounting performance. United HealthCare's offer includes a PPO (preferred provider organization) product that allows easier access to network providers without the need for referrals. Their offering also includes providing a \$75,000.00 annual wellness fund to be used to support initiatives.

The amounts shown in the carrier self-funded model represent the total fixed costs paid to the insurance carrier for administrative fees and specific stop loss insurance coverage plus expected annual claims and other fees paid directly by the county. The amounts shown in the third party administrator model represent payments made for administrative fees only with no insurance or pharmacy coverage included.

# Questions and Answers

Mike Fessinger: I'll just note that 2 current people voting on Bid Board were on the review committee. It would be my recommendation both Mr. Bargdill and Mr. Leeds abstain from this vote given they already recommended this be given to Bid Board.

Lindsay Poe Rousseau: Since it's tied to all employees, does that change? It's not on behalf of their department, it's on behalf of the entire organization.

Mike Fessinger: They're not recluded from voting under Charter 68. In my view, it would be more proper for them to abstain. There would still be 3 members left, which is enough to go ahead and approve this. If they do opt to vote, it wouldn't cast us in any kind of doubt. The safer position would be to have them abstain in my view.

Angela Caudillo: Did the RFP ask the bidders to give any different options for employees? Is that something that is done by the county?

Joe Thomas: There were several types of offers, bundled and unbundled.

Lindsay Poe Rousseau: This was just for the administrative service and type of administration benefits. The plan design will be up to us because we are self-funded. There will be further discussion with Commissioners on the 20th. That will be when the employees and Commissioners have the opportunity to decide. This is strictly who is going to administer the program.

Angela Caudillo: So those options are well within that administration?

Lindsay Poe Rousseau: Absolutely.

Russell Leeds: For the record, would you want to give a brief overview of the steps that were followed, including the interviews of the top 3 bidders.

Joe Thomas: In the Purchasing evaluation process, we put out the proposal and receive them back from the individual proposers. First we get together and put together a timeline and come back and score. Each individual member reads the proposals and prepares scoring for the individual proposals. Some of the proposals had a totally different approach and so we had to issue another addendum to clarify the approach that we decided would be in our best interest. The result was that 3 proposers responded, which is Aetna, Blue Cross Blue Shield, and United Healthcare. When they came back in, we had further interviews and we allowed the review committee to change their scores based on what they presented. We also had the assistance from a consultant.

Russell Leeds: So at face value, United Healthcare comes in with a low bid of \$34,033,934.80.

Joe Thomas: Yes.
