On the recommendation of Josh Lauber, on behalf of Public Works, Ellen House moved to accept the overall low bid from Cornejo Materials for an initial purchase in the amount of \$19,750.00 and establish contract pricing for one (1) year with two (2) one (1) year options to renew. Linda Kizzire seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

SB-2 Aggregate is used as the base material below concrete drainage structures or as drainage pipe backfill. The bid from Cornejo Materials represents a 1.28% price increase from the last contract established in 2015.

* NOTE:

The additional mileage and labor involved in picking up from Mid-States Materials, LLC (Mid-States) would incur an additional pick-up cost of \$22.93 per ton to their base bid. Mid-States is located in Grenola, Kansas, which is 63 additional miles to travel in each direction.

Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: You state that the \$19.75 per ton is the overall low bid, can you speak to the Mid-States Materials, LLC bid?

Jim Weber: This is material that we buy and then we haul it with our own trucks and people. Mid-States Materials, LLC is 70 miles down the road and Cornejo Materials is seven miles. When we take the trucking costs and add it to the cost of the actual material Cornejo Materials is considerably cheaper than going down to southwest Kansas to pick up Mid-States Materials, LLC. Then the middle bid when adding the trucking it would be higher than the low bid. The overall lowest cost is Cornejo Materials.

Russell Leeds: It's the best proposal based on a number of factors?

Jim Weber: Yes.

Linda Kizzire: What exactly is this going to cover? Replacement phones and replacement servers?

Joe Currier: This will cover phones, switches, routers, wireless devices, and the software to run all of them.

Linda Kizzire: I'm assuming that you reviewed the pricing in the contract and determined that it would be best for us to piggyback with the State.

Joe Currier: Yes, ma'am.

Russell Leeds: We did not have the pricing list. It says see pricing listed above NASPO agreement. But we did not have access to that.

On the recommendation of Josh Lauber, on behalf of Facilities Maintenance, Ellen House moved to accept both proposals from Professional Mechanical Contractors, Inc. and Commercial Trade Services, LLC and establish contract pricing for three (3) years with two (2) one (1) year options to renew. Linda Kizzire seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

A review committee comprised of Andrew Dilts, Kendal Ewing, Mike Callstrom, and Herschel Herring - Facilities Maintenance; Crystal Andreen - Risk Management; and Josh Lauber - Purchasing reviewed the responses. It was decided given the nature for on-call services that having two vendors awarded would best serve this need.

The on-call plumbing services contract is used for repairs and modifications to existing and new construction plumbing systems. In the event of an emergency, we have established response times and labor rates that allow us to authorize critical repairs without hesitation.

Questions and Answers

Angela Caudillo: Who are we currently utilizing?

Andrew Dilts: We currently have Commercial Trade Services.

On the recommendation of Josh Lauber, on behalf of Facilities Maintenance, Angela Caudillo moved to **accept the low bid from Combustion Controls, Inc. in the amount of \$25,132.00.** Russell Leeds seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Adult Detention Facility was originally constructed in 1988 with a single boiler that supplied heat to the entire facility. Boiler #2 was added during the large expansion project of 1998 and was designed to carry the load of the increased space. Both boilers work in conjunction with each other to supply heat to the entire facility. To operate the facility with only 1 of these boilers, we may not maintain acceptable room temperatures and have eliminated any redundant capacity for producing heat in the event of a breakdown.

Note

Boiler #2 is a larger capacity boiler than Boiler #1 and is being addressed first.

Questions and Answers

Angela Caudillo: On the recommended bid, the days to substantial completion, I assume that's from the time they start with that. Will that give us adequate time to get everything ready for the winter?

Andrew Dilts: Yes. We aren't going to be concerned with firing up either boiler until October. We think we'll have plenty of time.
