WICHITA, KAN. – A man has been sentenced after committing several felony crimes two years ago in Wichita. District Judge Seth Rundle sentenced Taylor Kremer, 28 of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, to 107 months with three years of post release.

On November 16, 2018, Kremer set his car on fire in an alley after being involved with a hit and run crash. Kremer pulled a bicycle from the burning vehicle and rode down an alley. Occupants of a nearby home followed him. While on the bicycle, Kremer fired shots at the people who were following him. He saw people on the porch of a house in the 500 block of E. Zimmerly and ordered them into the house at knifepoint. After taking cellphones from the five people, Kremer stole a car in the driveway.

Early the next morning, Wichita Police saw the stolen vehicle in the 800 block of S. Topeka and tried to stop it. After a high speed chase, the stolen car crashed near 13th and Shadyway which curves along the Little Arkansas River. Kremer ran on foot and was stopped by police who fired their tasers at him.

On September 21st, Kremer pled guilty to 15 felony crimes including kidnapping, aggravated robbery and aggravated burglary. When Judge Rundle sentenced Kremer Monday, he ordered that Kremer must register as a violent offender for 15 years for using a deadly weapon in the robberies and must register for life for the kidnappings.
