# DAYCARE GUIDANCE FOR ISOLATION

### ABLE TO WEAR A MASK

- 5 days at home from symptom onset or test date (no symptoms) with that date as Day 0
- If fever-free 24 hours without fever reducing medication and symptoms are gone or mostly gone, 5 additional days wearing a well-fitting mask at all times around others but can return to daycare

# DAYCARE GUIDANCE FOR **QUARANTINE**

For any of the below scenarios, if the close contact develops symptoms, they should stay home and be tested.

### ABLE TO WEAR A MASK

• 5 days at home from last exposure (Day 0), plus an additional 5 days wearing a well-fitting mask at all times around others



### **UNABLE TO WEAR A MASK**

• 10 days at home from last exposure (Day 0)

## HOUSEHOLD CONTACT

• 10 days of case's infectious period plus 5 days at home, then an additional 5 days wearing a mask (or 10 days if unable to wear a mask)
