This project includes asphalt surfacing, grading, drainage, seeding and traffic signs for just over one-half mile of roadway within the Drater Estates Addition Road Benefit District. A private developer has petitioned these improvements and all costs will be recovered through the imposition of a special tax assessment. **Questions and Answers**

Anna Meyerhoff-Cole: It says 12,000 credits per month, so is each text, call, or email an individual credit?

Lee Barrier: It is, I have that figure for you.

Tina Alstrom: Yes, the credits have a breakdown and one call or one text is one credit. Normally we do about 10,000 calls a month so we have a cushion in case we need those others. Emails are free, not really free, but included in that they don't take any credits. We get 12,000 free credits for email.
