- During the month of February, Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance Staff completed 7 residential program visits.
- Back in December the SCDDO hosted two brainstorming sessions as part of the Kansas Leadership Center’s “Beating the Virus” project. Community Council members and SCDDO staff came up with two projects we could do to play a part in helping during the pandemic. One project consisted of developing thank you postcards using art from individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (IDD) for families to share. The other project involved creating a flyer with truthful information on the COVID vaccines and helpful resources. In February, SCDDO staff and a Project SEARCH intern, hand stuffed over 3,000 envelopes with the flyer and postcards. Every individual and/or their guardian in the Sedgwick County IDD system, received the information and postcards.
