# About Recovery Connect

## What

- A Sedgwick County economic recovery program run by the Public Policy and Management Center (PPMC) at WSU

## Why

- To connect individuals, small businesses, and nonprofits to resources to help them recover from the pandemic

## How

- Funded by Sedgwick County through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA); Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds





# Who We Serve

## Individuals

- Provide solutions to individuals seeking to reenter the workforce but face barriers in accessing training programs

## Nonprofits

- Provide assistance to nonprofit organizations seeking grant funding

## Businesses

- Provide resources to struggling businesses to remain open and operating during the pandemic

## Access

Create equitable access.

- Needs: understand community needs and barriers to recovery
- Initial Assessment: meet with a Recovery Connect specialist
- Referrals: refer participants to program and resource partners

## Support


Refer to 1:1 assistance.

- Workshops: bi-weekly grant writing workshops



**Mortgage, Rent, Utilities, & Taxes** -

**Rent, Utility, and Internet Assistance**

- For: Renters financially impacted by the pandemic
- From: Kansas Housing Resource Corporation (KHRC) Kansas Emergency Rental Assistance (KERA) program

**Wichita Emergency Rental Assistance Program (WERAP)**

- For: Renting households with an income below 80% of the area median income (AMI). Depending on availability, the funding can be used for past due rent & utilities, future rent & utilities, or a total of up to 15 months of assistance. The family must:
  - Have past rent due and/or utilities and must have received an eviction notice or demand for payment.
  - Have a COVID-19 related economic impact such as loss of job, reduced tips, or increased child care or medical expenses.

**The Emergency Water Assistance Program (EWAP)**

- For: Households that are currently disconnected or at risk of becoming disconnected from drinking and/or wastewater services (under 15% of the federal poverty level)
- From: Kansas Department for Children and Families. The Emergency Water Assistance Program (EWAP)
- How: The application form is [online](#)

- Deadline: OPEN. Funds available until exhausted

**The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)**

- For: Eligible households can receive a one-time per year benefit to help pay a portion of their home energy costs.
