

MEETING UPDATE

December 5, 2007

Below is a brief overview of the Sedgwick County Commission Meeting for December 5, 2007. You may find the agenda and streaming video on our Web site at www.sedgwickcounty.org.

Introduction of EMS Director Steve Cotter. Mr. Cotter began at EMS on Monday, December 3, after coming from Greenville County, South Carolina.

Public Hearing regarding whether the City of Maize has provided services as set out in annexation plans

- Commissioners supported the work that the City of Maize has done in providing services and assuring that services have been delivered according to the service plan. (5-0)

Code Enforcement - Building Codes:

- Commissioners held public hearings and approved the official residential and commercial building codes for Sedgwick County. (5-0)
- Commissioners held a public hearing and approved the international mechanical code, the international residential code and the international fuel gas code as the official mechanical code for Sedgwick County. (5-0)

Planning - Arena Neighborhood Redevelopment Plan:

- Commissioners heard a presentation on November 7 regarding the Arena Neighborhood Redevelopment Plan as an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan, but the resolution failed. The item was returned to the MAPC, but did not receive a recommendation from MAPC because of their 7-3 vote. The plan was approved by the Wichita City Council on November 6 to provide direction for redevelopment in

the area surrounding the Arena. Commissioners approved this as an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan. (3-2)

- Commissioners approved a zone change generally located on the southeast corner of 31st St. South and Rock Road from SF-20 to LC. (5-0)

COMCARE:

- Commissioners approved an agreement with Joan Hertlein to provide inpatient psychiatric care (\$11,520) (5-0)
- Commissioners approved a grant application to WSU Kid's Training Team for a two-day workshop for mental health workers (\$8,798 grant request) (5-0)

Department on Aging:

- Commissioners approved 18 targeted case management contracts to help provide in-home services to keep seniors independent in their homes. These services help more than 1000 individuals stay independent in their communities. (Medicaid funding) (5-0)

Bid Board:

- Data Storage - COMCARE: Contract with Xiotech, \$64,477.
- Computer Hardware - Corrections: purchase of 31 Dell computers, \$35,834.32.
- Unemployment Cost Management Services - Human Resources: TALX Corporation, \$19,844 for three-year cost (additional options to renew)
- Software Enhancements - Appraiser: Tyler Technologies, \$191,400 for Economic Unit (Income) Value Distribution module for CAMA system.
