Commissioner Parks was absent for item 1.

Retirement

Commissioners approved the presentation of a retirement clock to Karen Mahan, administrative specialist in the clerk's office who will retire April 1, 2010, after 20 years of service. (4-0)

Presentation

Commissioners approved the presentation of a citizen commendation award. (5-0)

Public Hearing

Commissioners approved the public hearing to consider adoption of the new fireworks codes. (4-1)

New Business

- Commissioners approved the agreement with the Haysville Public Library for an office for a COMCARE Children's case manager. (5-0)
- Commissioners approved the Kansas Juvenile Justice Authority (JJA) SFY11 Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) Award. (5-0)

Board of Bids and Contracts

Commissioners approved the Report of the Board of Bids and Contracts regular meeting on March 18, 2010: (5-0)

- Change order # 5 - Forensic Science Center Expansion (Facilities Dept.) - Conco, Inc., \$21,300.00 and 53 additional days to contract time.
- Road improvements (public works) - Cornejo & Sons, \$485,122.35.
- Sedgwick County Munger Building Sidewalk upgrades (facilities dept.) - Barkley Construction, \$30,600 and establish unit pricing for concrete.
- Classroom chairs for the National Center for Aviation Training (facilities dept.) - John A. Marshall, \$123,869.06.
- Influenza vaccine (health dept.) - Sanofi Pasteur, Inc., \$80,129.56.
- Alkaline batteries (emergency medical services and various depts.) - Grainger and establish contract pricing for one year, with two one-year options to renew.
- Fire arms (sheriff's office) - OMB Guns, \$94,634.
- Asbestos abatement for Friendly Gables Building (facilities dept.) - Enviro Remediation, Inc., \$19,450.
- Various four door pickup trucks (fleet management) - Don Hattan Chevrolet for items 1 & 2a, \$94,470.00. Shawnee Mission Ford for item 2b, \$21,317. Rusty Eck Ford for items 3a and 4, \$70,353.
- Various full size vans (fleet management) - Rusty Eck Ford for the 12-passenger full size van, the 8-passenger full size van, \$41,700 and Shawnee Mission Ford for the full size cargo van, \$16,342.
