Sedgwick County Commission meetings are held at 9 a.m. every Wednesday at the Sedgwick County Courthouse, 525 N. Main, 3rd floor.

Are the Commission meetings broadcast?

Commission meetings are broadcast at 9 a.m. on Wednesdays on KPTS, Channel 8. Rebroadcasts appear on the City of Wichita’s cable Channel 7 on Wednesdays at 6 p.m. and Saturdays and Sundays at 10 a.m.

Are copies of the agenda available?

Commission meeting agendas can be reviewed on the Sedgwick County Web site at www.sedgwickcounty.org. Agendas are updated every Friday for the following week’s agenda.

The County Manager meets with the media to review the agenda every Monday at 9:30 a.m. in the County Board Room, 525 N. Main, Suite 343. With Monday holidays, this meeting moves to Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m.

Can the media attend Commission staff meetings?

Commission staff meetings are open meetings, thus members of the media are welcome to attend.

Is the media informed of any special meetings or events?

Media releases are sent for any event where more than two Commissioners may attend, except for the routine meetings indicated above. Releases will also be sent for any special Commission meetings or workshops.
