

TEAM JUSTICE MINUTES

May 2, 2003

- I. **Approval of Team Justice Minutes from April 4, 2003 Meeting:** Members reviewed the April Team Justice minutes. **ACTION ITEM:** Ron Terzian moved, Jeannine Lane seconded, all members agreed and the motion carried to accept the April 4, 2003 minutes as submitted.
- II. **Announcement: Judge Karen Langston Appointed to Vacant Position** – Chris Kautzer announced that Judge Langston had been appointed by the Sedgwick County Board of County Commissioners to the general vacant position. The other vacant position is for an Ex-Officio and will not be filled at this time. In addition, Chris provided members with an updated Team Justice Roster.
- III. **Feedback from Commissioners – SFY04 Community Funding Plan Grant Application** – Mark Masterson provided members with a summary of his presentation to the Sedgwick County Board of County Commissioners regarding the SFY04 Community Funding Grant Application and local juvenile justice system activities for 2000-2002. There has been a decrease in juvenile arrests, court filings, state custody average caseload, and juvenile correctional facility commitments. During SFY03 and SFY04 Sedgwick County will receive a total \$1,118,556 (21%) reduction in Juvenile Justice Authority funds. The Commissioners thanked the Team Justice Board, subcommittees, and staff for their work on behalf of juvenile justice in Sedgwick County.
- IV. **SFY04 Juvenile Accountability Incentive Block Grant (JAIBG) Application: Team Justice Signatures** - Discussion was held regarding \$12,703 in unallocated SFY04 - JAIBG funding. Topics included holding strength-based training for staff that provide direct service to juvenile offenders. **ACTION ITEM:** Pat Hanrahan moved, Marilyn Cook seconded, all members agreed and the motion carried to adjust the SFY04 - JAIBG application to include the unallocated JAIBG funding of \$12,703. The revised budgets will add \$2,326 for training bringing the total amount for training to \$5,000. The balance of \$10,377 will be shared among the other applicants. Chris Kautzer requested that the members sign the Local Juvenile Crime Enforcement Coalition Form that is required for the SFY04 - JAIBG application.
- V. **ACTION ITEM: Technical Budget Adjustment –Parent Training** - Chris Kautzer presented a budget adjustment from the Parent Training program. After discussing the reason for the request: **ACTION ITEM:** Ron Terzian moved, John Green seconded, all members agreed and the motion carried approving the budget adjustment request.
- VI. **Cancellation of Title V Funding** - Chris Kautzer announced that the federal Title V funding has been cancelled. The Kansas Advisory Group has carryover funds from the previous fiscal year, and will make them available to programs that currently receive funding. The Sedgwick County Sheriff's SCORE Program is the only program in the 18th Judicial District that currently receives Title V funds.
- VII. **OJJDP Technical Assistance – Disproportionate Minority Confinement** – Dr. Delores Craig-Moreland and Mark Masterson participated in a conference call with representatives from OJJDP. The discussion centered on the Detention Advocacy Service program in Sedgwick County and the method by which data is collected to measure outcomes.
- VIII. **Other Business** - Dr. Delores Craig-Moreland asked for an update on the Community Service Intervention Fund. There is an ongoing community discussion regarding the possible loss of funding for the Wichita Children's Home to complete CINC assessments.
