Can you give an example of breaking the law?

To do a good job, the defense lawyer tries to find out if we are telling the truth, or if we have made a mistake, or if we have made up something. That is why the defense lawyer gets a chance to ask us questions after the District Attorney has finished asking questions.

We have to listen to everyone's questions carefully and understand them before we answer.

Sometimes when we are talking in court, the defense lawyer may stand up and interrupt us to talk to the judge. Do not worry. We have not done or said anything wrong. No one is angry at us. All we have to do is stop talking until the judge or the District Attorney asks us to continue.
