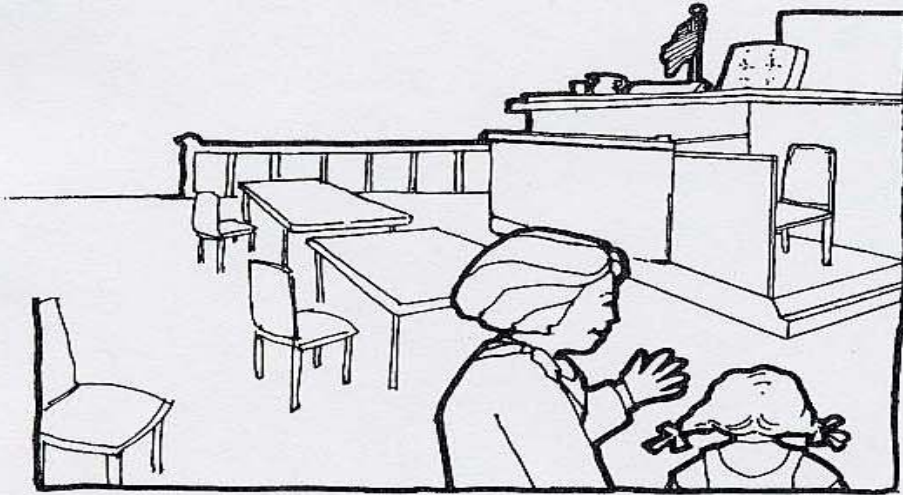


# a witness do ?



The District Attorney or Victim Witness Coordinator will show us a courtroom before it is time for us to be witnesses. If we have any questions after we see the courtroom, we can always ask the District Attorney or Victim Witness Coordinator.



Some kids are scared about going to court. If we are scared, we should tell the District Attorney or Victim Witness Coordinator.

In court sometimes the judge can order "sequestration" of the witnesses. This word means that when you give evidence, no other witnesses can be with you in the courtroom. It also means that you cannot talk about the evidence you gave until the trial is over. If you have any questions about this, ask your District Attorney. If your Mom and Dad are witnesses, you can take a special friend like the Victim Witness Coordinator with you into the courtroom to help you feel comfortable.
