**Avery Elofsson** is the Chief Attorney over the Economic Crimes Unit. He and his assistant district attorneys prosecute all manner of property crimes, including business and residential burglaries, organized retail theft, financial crimes, elder abuse and business fraud.

Avery Elofsson has been with the Office of the District Attorney since 2008. As a Senior Assistant District Attorney handled complex litigation such as data breach, frauds, piracy, counterfeit, elder abuse, multi-defendant cases, and homicides. In 2016, Avery was put in charge of the Consumer Protection Division for the Office where he was responsible for all civil litigation, settlements, and public relations. After building up the division, Avery returned to full-time criminal prosecution in 2021. Avery has prosecuted nearly 1,700 matters, made approximately 3,000 court appearances, and tried over 50 felony cases. Avery graduated law school in 2008 from Chicago-Kent College of Law, where he received the Dean's Distinguished Public Service Award and was both the Student Bar Association's (Evening Division) Vice President and the Hispanic Law Student Association's President. Avery works throughout the community by presenting on public safety, economic loss, and elder abuse.
