

# Why

 To connect individuals, small businesses, and nonprofits to resources to help them recover from the pandemic

## How

 Funded by Sedgwick County through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA); Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

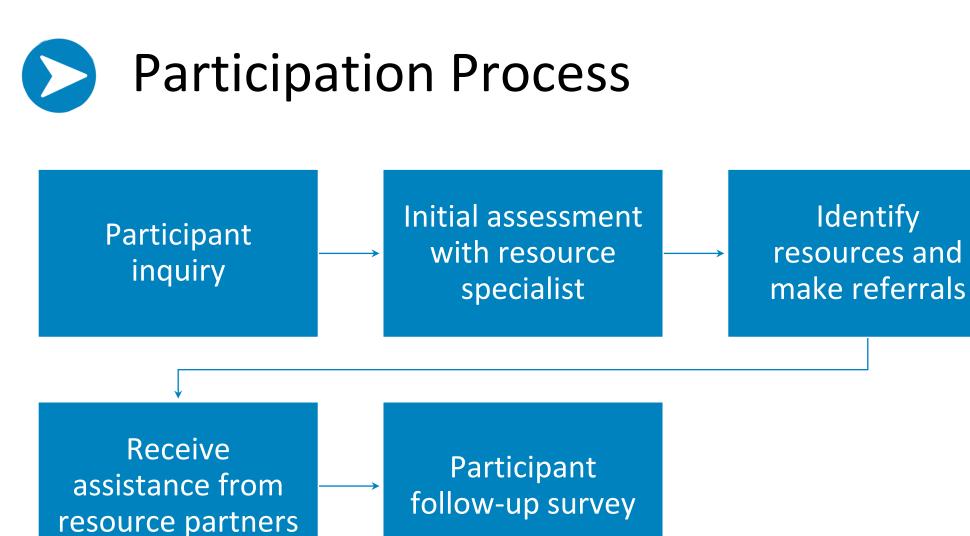
## Assistance: provided by program and resource partners

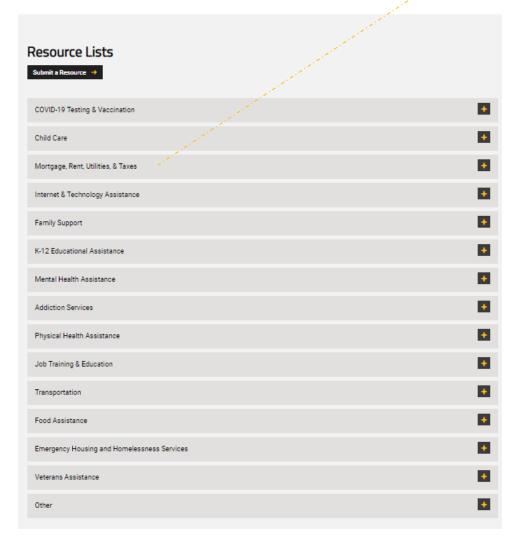

#### Mortgage, Rent, Utilities, & Taxes

- Rent, Utility, and Internet Assistance
- · For: Renters financially impacted by the pandemic
- From: Kansas Housing Resource Corporation (KHRC) Kansas Emergency Rental Assistance (KERA) program
- How: Apply online

Child Care

- Deadline: OPEN

#### Wichita Emergency Rental Assistance Program (WERAP)

- For: Renting households with an income below 80% of the area median income (AMI). Depending on availability, the funding can be used for past due rent & utilities, future rent & utilities, or a total of up to 15 months of assistance. The family must:
  - Have past rent due and/or utilities and must have received an eviction notice or demand for payment.
  - Have a COVID-19 related economic impact such as loss of job, reduced tips, or increased child care or medical expenses.
- From: The City of Wichita
- How: Apply online

- Deadline: OPEN

#### The Emergency Water Assistance Program (EWAP)

- For Households that are currently disconnected or at risk of becoming disconnected from drinking and/or wastewater services (under 15% of the federal poverty level)
- From: Kansas Department for Children and Families. The Emergency Water Assistance Program (EWAP)
- How: The application form is <u>online</u>
- More info: Visit DCFs website
- Deadline: OPEN. Funds available until exhausted

#### The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)

- · For: Eligible households can receive a one-time per year benefit to help pay a portion of their home energy costs.
- From: Kansas Department for Children and Families
- How: Apply online through DCP's portal. Print applications that can be mailed or emailed to DCF are also available at online.
- More info: Visit DCFs website
- Deadline: March 31, 2022 at 5 pm

#### Kansas Homeowner Assistance Fund (KHAF)

- For: Kansas homeowners financially impacted by the pandemic needing help with mortgages, property taxes, homeowners' insurance, energy costs, and more.
- From: Kansas Housing Corp
- How: Homeowners will submit applications online. Application link can be found on their website.
