On the recommendation of Iris Baker, on behalf of the Appraiser’s Office, Don Brace moved to **accept the alternate proposal from ACA and execute a contract in the amount of \$198,584.25**. Irene Hart seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Note: Digital Oblique imagery is 3-dimensional technology that includes the ability to see angles, view exterior detail, and has a measuring tool. A committee comprised of the Appraiser, DIO, GIS and purchasing departments evaluated responses, checked references and viewed demonstrations of the vendor’s products.

The responses from Pictometry and ACA included 6-inch pixels (suburban areas) and 12-inch pixels (rural areas). The ACA (Alternate) proposal was for 4-inch pixel (suburban areas) and 9-inch pixel (rural areas) images, which will improve the quality of images and will enhance the ability to obtain accurate measures.

\*Pictometry’s proposal would also require Sedgwick County to pay \$25 for each image that is provided to a customer as Sedgwick County would not own the images (no cost assumptions are included in the listed project cost). ACA’s proposal does not require Sedgwick County to charge customers that receive an image as Sedgwick County would own the images.
