On behalf of the Tag Office recommend to **accept the low responsible proposal from AllSecure, Inc. for \$8,730.60 and establish contract pricing for three years with two (2) one (1) options to renew.**

Note: After a committee review consisting of Linda Kizzire, Deputy Treasurer; Jo Hillman, Tag Office Manager; Martha Herridge, Assistant Tag Office Manager; and Randall Temple, Purchasing Agent; and with follow-up conversations with the vendors for clarification of their proposals, it was decided in the best interest of Sedgwick County to accept the low responsible bid from Allsecure, Inc. Alarm and Security Specialists proposal was incomplete and would have to of be altered to cover the scope of work proposed, and the system doesn't meet the criteria for an emergency situation. If panic button (silent alarm) is pushed instead of going straight to the Police Department for automatic dispatch, it's routed to their system first and then they call Police Department, Fire Department, or whatever emergency agency is required.
