On the recommendation of Dallas Shaffer, on behalf of the Department of Corrections, Anne Smarsh moved to **accept the proposals and execute service provider agreements with Episcopal Social Services for \$9,000.00, Kansas Children's Service League for \$3,950.00, Kansas Legal Services for \$1,130.00, Office of the District Attorney for \$4,695.00, United Methodist Youthville for \$3,570.00 and Youth for Christ for \$715.00.** Ron Estes seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Note: A committee consisting of Dr. Delores Craig-Moreland, WSU; Pat Hanrahan, United Way; Marty Hughes, Finance; Jennifer Magana, Assistant County Counselor; Gloria Markuly, SRS; Dallas Shaffer, Purchasing; Tom Kimbrell, Steven Stonehouse, and Mark Masterson of Corrections evaluated all proposal responses based on the goals of the Committee on Mini Grant Program for Evidence-Based Programming, content of the response, cost, qualifications and experience of the agency, and the availability of agencies to work with those being served. Chris Morales and Jodi Tronsgard both assisted in the process. The Center for Health and Wellness did not qualify because they are already certified and their proposal response indicated the funds would be used for staffing the grant cannot be used for personnel costs.

The Mini Grant Program for Evidence-Based Programming provides education and training, services, implementation of programs and monitors fidelity to at-risk youth.
