

## DOES YOUR -CHILD HAVE...





PROUD OF ME is a program for young children ages 2 1/2 to 5 years old who have challenging behaviors

The purpose of the program is to provide a supportive environment where children can develop and practice the social, emotional and behavioral skills needed to succeed in school, at home and in the community.

PROUD OF ME is designed to work in conjunction with academically based preschools.

PROUD OF ME has morning and afternoon programs operating Monday through Wednesday. Children generally attend for 12 months, however, length of service and frequency of service per week are both based on each child's individual needs.

PROUD OF ME teaches children self control, conflict resolution, problem solving skills and more to encourage healthy social and emotional development. "Conscious Discipline" by Dr. Becky Bailey is the foundation for the program interventions.

## Children will receive:

- Development of new interpersonal skills through structured therapeutic interventions and activities.
  - Opportunities to practice their new skills in a peer group with staff support and guidance.

## IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE?

Children ages 2 1/2 to 5 years old who have serious social, emotional or behavioral problems that cause serious disruption to family, preschool, child care or other community relationships may be eligible. Eligibility will be determined by a qualified mental health professional at COMCARE of Sedgwick County. Children must be residents of Sedgwick County to be considered for admission to PROUD OF ME.

NO ONE WILL BE TURNED AWAY BASED ON INABILITY TO PAY

COMCARE of Sedgwick County will work with families to find and access resources. Some methods of payment include private insurance and Medicaid.

## -ADDITIONAL PROGRAM SERVICES

Case Management: As part of the program, each child will receive a case manager to coordinate the treatment team and advocate for the child and family.

Attendant Care: Children can receive individual support and assistance with meeting goals at school, in the home, and in the community.

Therapy: Families can choose to participate in individual and/or family therapy. Therapy services may be coordinated through your child's case manager.

Parent Coaching and Parenting Classes: The case manager includes the parent in coaching sessions with the child to help the parent learn the therapeutic interventions utilized in the PROUD OF ME program. Parenting classes are also available to help parents learn new ways to manage their child's behaviors and help their child progress toward treatment goals.
