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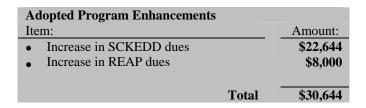

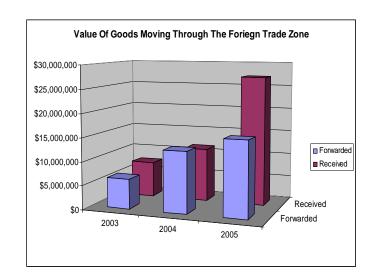
□ Promote a strong and diverse regional economy by increasing opportunity for all businesses to retain and attract new jobs to Sedgwick County.

Economic Development promotes a strong and diverse regional economy by helping local businesses grow, increasing opportunity for international trade, and attracting new jobs to Sedgwick County. Several programs are coordinated under Economic Development to achieve this goal.

The Sedgwick County Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) is a general purpose zone where foreign and domestic goods are not within U.S. Customs territory. The zone is ready to work for businesses involved in international trade whether it is manufacturing, assembly or even distribution. Air, rail and surface transportation users find the international trade services and facilities convenient, user friendly and highly cost effective in the long run.

Users of the FTZ are exempt from paying duty or federal excise taxes while the goods remain in the zone until exported are picked up for local distribution and use. Funding is used to promote the zone itself, training and travel expenses for economic development staff.

In 2002, Sedgwick County established a pilot program to focus on business development, commercial revitalization, and job creation in certain neighborhoods. Plans have been developed and adopted for McAdams and Oaklawn neighborhoods and are being implemented through public and private partnerships to encourage business startups by residents in the neighborhoods.

The Sedgwick County Micro-Loan program is one such way of promoting development within these neighborhoods, The Micro-Loan program assists low and moderate income persons establish or expand business in Sedgwick County, but outside Wichita city limits. Loan funds can be used for:

- Startup or expansion equipment
- Increasing inventory
- Leases and lease hold improvements
- Purchasing a building
- Advertising
- Transportation

The Micro-Loan program gives special incentives in the Oaklawn-Sunview communities and women and minorities are encouraged to apply. Loan applications are available at many locations throughout Sedgwick County. For the location nearest you, call the South Central Kansas Economic Development District (SCKEDD) Office at (316) 262-7035 for information. The partnership between Sedgwick County and SCKEDD allows SCKEDD to provide technical assistance and training to the Micro-Loan borrower both before and after the business starts up.

In addition to partnering with SCKEDD, Economic Development partners with Regional Economic Area Partnership (REAP) and the Greater Wichita Economic Development Coalition (GWEDC). The County takes a regional approach to economic development by working with other area organizations. This eliminates duplication of efforts and mixed messages and improves cooperation to retain and promote business in the region.
