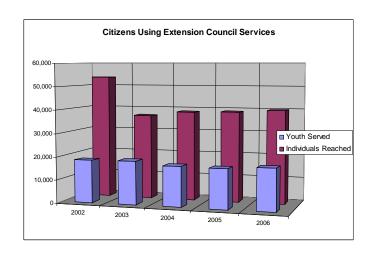
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Dedicated to a safe, sustainable, competitive food and fiber system and to strong, healthy communities, families, and youth through integrated research, analysis, and education.

The Sedgwick County Extension Council provides educational seminars and information on a variety of topics: (1) Family and Consumer Sciences includes food safety, nutrition, clothing, housing, environmental issues, personal budgeting, parenting, assistance to the elderly regarding health care and insurance-related issues; (2) 4-H and Youth includes educational opportunities for the positive development of youth; (3) Agriculture and Horticulture Education includes providing information to landowners regarding farming and gardening, soil testing, and information regarding composting and environmental safety.

The Extension Council is funded by Sedgwick County, the federal government, and the State of Kansas (both federal and state funds are allocated through Kansas State University). Sedgwick County allocates quarterly payments to the Extension Council for its annual contribution.

The Extension Council's initiatives and efforts during and after the January 4th and 5th 2005 ice storm recovery



effort, received a Search for Excellence Award from the National County Agents Association. Homeowners and landscape service providers were educated on how to care for damaged trees. Proper disposal and information was provided on what types of landscaping to utilize for replacing permanently damaged vegetation with natural species of Kansas to reduce the potential for future

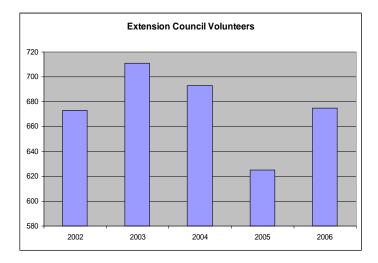
