Discussion

Sheriff Easter called the meeting to order. It was not determined that a quorum was present when the meeting was called to order.

1. The minutes from May 22, 2014, were not approved as it was not determined that a quorum was present when the meeting was called to order.
2. New Business
 - a. Criminal Justice System Population Discussion
 - i. Sheriff Easter stated that the ADP (average daily population) for out-of-county is higher than normal at this time but is lower overall than the same time last year.
 - b. Update on obtaining data regarding the re-offense rates for those on pretrial services.
 - i. Tom Struble provided the Pretrial Services Program strategic plan to those in attendance as the plan has data regarding the yearly percentages for bond



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revocations due to new crimes. The rates are as follows: 8% in 2011, 7% in 2012, 6% in 2013, and the projection for 2014 is 7%.

- ii. A question was asked about obtaining data regarding the re-offense rates for individuals with felony versus misdemeanor charges and what the re-offense crimes were.
 - c. Update on obtaining data to compare re-offense rates of those on pretrial services with those out on bond.
 - i. Tom Struble again discussed the yearly rates in the pretrial services program strategic plan; however, data was not available at the meeting regarding the re-offense rates for individuals out on bond.
 - d. Update on obtaining data regarding the re-offense rates for those out on bond and those that are not charged.
 - i. Neither Ellen House nor Jeanette Clary were present to discuss the item so the item will be kept on the agenda for the next meeting.
3. Old Business
- a. None.
4. Other Business
- a. It was discussed that of the individuals in jail, not many are being held on drug charges. The majority of the individuals are there for serious crimes or commitments. It was reported that EMC (exploited and missing child) and ICAC (internet crimes against children) cases are "exploding".
 - b. It was discussed that due to a new court ruling the jail can no longer hold BICE individuals without any charges. Therefore, an email is sent to BICE to inform them of the individual's release.
 - c. Judge Kisner discussed that when a case is continued by a defendant's attorney it has to be done in consult with the defendant, according to statute. Judge Kisner said there needs to be compliance with the statute and that the consults actually need to occur. There were concerns regarding the effect this will have on lawyers, the jail population, and clients to court.
5. Public Comment
- a. A public comment was made about the movement to decriminalize marijuana possession in Wichita.
