Wichita, Kansas – A former Wichita truck driving school and its owner have entered into a consent judgment with the Office of the District Attorney involving allegations of falsely representing that they were approved by the Kansas Board of Regents and Members of the Wichita Chamber of Commerce. The agreement between Wichita Truck Driving School, LLC aka Wichita Truck Driving CDL-Assist, LLC (WTDS), owned and operated by Tandy Noeller aka Tandy McKenzie and the District Attorney through the Consumer Protection Division calls for WTDS and McKenzie to pay back \$6,000.00 in restitution to former students who had paid McKenzie for tuition, along with court costs.

In Kansas, suppliers cannot willfully fail to state a material fact, conceal a material fact, nor can they represent they have sponsorship or approval that they do not have. WTDS and McKenzie agreed to refrain from deceptive or unconscionable practices in this or any other future businesses they operate. The consent judgment was filed in Sedgwick County District Court on June 29, 2017.
