Wichita, Kansas – A man found guilty of aggravated battery, aggravated assault, criminal discharge of a firearm and cruelty to animals has been sentenced to over 20 years in prison. Wednesday afternoon Damion Looney, 29 of Wichita, was sentenced by District Judge Jeffrey Syrios to 251 months in prison.

On July 24th, 2015 Looney shot Quinton Edwards at a home in the 300 block of N. Elizabeth after Looney argued with his girlfriend at a Wichita tavern. Edwards lost his eye in the attack.

During the investigation, a video surfaced showing Looney throwing a kitten against a wall. The animal was later euthanized. Before the trial began in October, Looney pled guilty to one felony count of cruelty to animals.

At the conclusion of the trial on November 1st, a jury found Looney guilty of two counts of aggravated battery, two counts of aggravated assault, criminal discharge of a firearm and criminal possession of a weapon by a convicted felon.
