Wichita, Kansas - Two men were sentenced to lengthy prison terms this week in District Court in Wichita.

On Wednesday, Judge Joe Kisner sentenced a man to 308 months in prison for a 2015 home invasion in Wichita. Dallas Clayborn, 21 of Wichita, was convicted by a Sedgwick County jury in February on three counts including two counts of aggravated robbery and one count of aggravated burglary. The incident occurred on January 13, 2015 in the 3800 block of East Funston in Wichita.

The victims testified that three masked men broke into their home armed with weapons and demanded money. The men duct-taped the 64-year-old male victim and held a 45 year old female victim and her 3 year old grandson at gunpoint while ransacking the home. A 6 year old grandson was also present, but slept through the incident. Wichita Police were able to identify Clayborn based on a DNA match recovered from a roll of duct tape left in the home. Security video recovered from Wal-Mart also showed Clayborn using the credit cards belonging to the victims within hours of the robbery. This case was ordered to run consecutive to the 130 month sentence previously imposed for an attempted aggravated robbery committed by Clayborn in 2014.

On Tuesday, Judge David Kaufman sentenced a man to life in prison on charges of aggravated criminal sodomy, aggravated indecent liberties with a child, and 2 counts of sexual exploitation of a child.

On March 16, 2014 Wichita Police were dispatched after a business found a cell phone containing photos of child pornography. An investigation by detectives with the Exploited and Missing Child Unit identified the owner of the phone as Aaron Cessna, 22 of Wichita. The cell phone had video of Cessna engaged in various sex acts with 2 different children, both of whom were under five years old.

Cessna will be eligible for parole after serving over 51 years in prison.
