

Margaret McIntire is the Chief of the Charging Unit. Prosecutors have the responsibility of determining what cases are charged within the criminal court system. In Sedgwick County, law enforcement agencies investigate cases and make appointments with attorneys in the charging unit of the District Attorney's Office who decide what, if any, are the appropriate charges to file. The charging unit reviews approximately 11,000 mostly felony adult and juvenile criminal matters each year.

Ms. McIntire graduated from Kansas State University in 1984 with a Bachelor of Science. She received her Juris Doctor from Washburn University School of Law in 1987. Before joining the District Attorney's Office in Sedgwick County in 1995, Ms. McIntire's legal background included the City Attorney's Office in Topeka, the Shawnee County District Attorney's Office and the Cowley County Attorney's Office.

Ms. McIntire is an adjunct professor at Wichita State University and has held similar positions at Washburn University School of Law and Cowley Community College.
