- **I. Introductions and Announcements** Tam Clark and Courtney Purser were introduced to the board.
- II. Approval of January Minutes –

 <u>A motion to approve the January minutes was made by Kelli Grant, seconded by Deanna Carrithers and unanimously approved.</u>
- **III. Justice Reinvestment Initiative Update** Jay Holmes provided a brief update on the status of the behavioral health programming. COMCARE filled the residential therapist position and is now fully staffed. Cognitive behavioral groups are still being offered and will begin a pilot project to measure fidelity and impact of the programming.
- **IV. SFY2018 Comprehensive Plan Development** Jay Holmes informed the board that the SFY18 Comprehensive Plan was received from KDOC. The plan will be developed and presented to the board for approval. Jay encouraged board members to provide input for items that should be included in the plan. The approved plan is due to KDOC on or before May 1st, 2017.
- **V. State Budget Update** Glenda Martens reported that nothing has been released regarding the budget and that flat funding is expected for adult and juvenile community corrections.
- VI. Gang Curfew Overview Tam Clark and Courtney Purser provided an overview of the history of gang member curfew checks and the current processes. Curfew checks are completed bi-monthly with assistance from law enforcement. The November 3, 2016 checks showed 43 active documented gang members. Outcomes from the recent curfew checks were provided to the board.

VII. Program Updates -

a. Field Services – Jay Holmes

- The ADP for January was 1,619 compared to 1,634 last January.
- The Assessment of Yourself (AOY) and Personal Inventory Criminal Thinking Styles (PICTS) assessment tools will start being used March 1st. Data will be compiled and submitted to Dr. Holsinger.

b. Residential – Lori Gibbs

- The ADP for January was 64 compared to 63 last January. The funded capacity at the center is 65.
- The residential facility is planning to propose a pilot residential program for Level 1 offenders by the middle of 2017. Updates will be provided to the board.
