Restrooms | The men's and women's<br>restrooms are totally<br>inaccessible due to<br>numerous inconsistencies,<br>but mainly because they<br>exist on a lower level<br>accessed only by steps. | 4.23                    | Inconsistencies include, but are not limited to, steps leading to<br>restrooms, signage not in Braille, round lavatory faucet knobs exist,<br>water closet is not centered, narrow stalls, pipes exposed under<br>lavatories, no lowered urinal, round door hardware exists on the<br>entrance doors, toilet paper dispensers inappropriately located, etc.<br>In new construction, ADAAG requires all public restrooms to be<br>fully accessible. However, this facility is not considered new<br>construction, and therefore falls under the program access provisions<br>of Title II. Each and every public restroom may not need to be made<br>accessible according to program access.
