Restrooms	Both public restrooms are totally inaccessible due to numerous inconsistencies.	<u>4.23</u>	Inconsistencies include, but are not limited to, no Braille signage at entrance doors, exposed pipes exist under lavatories, no grab bars at rear of water closets, toilet seats too low, mirror too high, coat hoots too high, urinal is located too high, designated accessible stalls are too narrow, etc. We recommend making this restroom fully accessible according to ADAAG specifications, or accessible to the extent it is technically feasible to do so. Interior	Some displays and display lights are protruding objects.	<u>4.4</u>	Where objects protrude from walls more than 4-inches and their leading edge is higher than 27-inches and lower than 80-inches, these objects are considered protruding objects, which may not be detectable by individuals who are blind and use a cane. Interior	The L-shaped set of ramps leading to and from the telescope are too steep and do not provide appropriate handrails on each side.	<u>4.8</u>	The slope of the existing ramp is steeper than ADAAG's maximum of 8.33%. The existing ramps measure about 9% running slopes. In addition, ADAAG specifies that accessible routes with running slopes greater than 5% provide handrails on each side. Modify the ramps so that appropriate handrails exist on each side. We do not recommend that the surfaces of these ramps be modified until a point where the facility and ramps are renovated, since the degree of excessive slope is so minor and the cost would be substantial.
