(Sedgwick County, Kan.) – This year Severe Weather Awareness Week in Kansas is March 4 through 10. The statewide tornado drill is scheduled for Tuesday, March 6 at 10 a.m. Please note, Sedgwick County Emergency Management will not test sirens at noon on Monday rather they will be tested at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, weather permitting.

To help the community prepare for severe weather, Emergency Management is holding severe weather safety classes throughout Sedgwick County. The presentations are designed to teach attendees the about severe weather and ways to stay safe. Classes are free of charge to residents.
