On behalf of the Division of Human Services, recommend to **accept the proposals and execute service provider agreements with Wichita State University for \$50,086.00 and Rainbows United, Inc. for \$46,662.00.**

A committee consisting of Jeannette Livingston, Contract Administrator - COMCARE, Dee Staudt, Director - SCDDO, John Sullivan, Assistant Director - SCDDO, Brandi Loudermilk, Single Point of Entry Coordinator, Heather Pace, Behavioral Services Coordinator - SCDDO, Marty Hughes, Revenue Manager - Finance, and Joe Thomas, Purchasing evaluated all proposal responses based on the goals of the Committee overseeing early intervention and therapeutic services, proposal content, cost, qualifications, experience of the agency, and the availability of the agency to work with those being served.

Sedgwick County is allocating approximately \$100,000.00 annually to support early intervention and therapeutic services programs targeted to individuals with intellectual disabilities and co-occurring mental health disorders and their families.

Question was asked: How are payments made, fee-for-service or case rate? Payments to these service providers will be made quarterly in advance of service delivery. The providers will then provide us with reports and we reconcile them.
