On the recommendation of Kimberly Evans, on behalf of the Elections Office, Jennifer Dombaugh moved to accept the bid from Mainline Printing, Inc. at the rates listed for one (1) year with two (2), one (1) year options to renew. Tim Kaufman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Elections Office has the majority of their ballot printing done in-house, however it is necessary to have an external vendor on-call for these services in the event of equipment failure/malfunction or staffing issues that may arise during the time ballots are printed.

These services are in place as a back-up solution or to supplement the ballots being printed in-house, therefore no estimated annual cost is available at this time.

Question - Do you know why we received only one bid, and so many no bids? Kim Evans explained that ballot printing is a very tedious process and that there are registration marks which must be printed exactly so that the voting equipment will read the ballots. Most vendors do not have the capacity to attain the standards that are required and therefore do not want to take on the liability for those projects.
