On the recommendation of Kimberly Bush, on behalf of Project Services, Talaya Schwartz moved to accept the low bid including Alternate 1 from Compton Construction Services, LLC in the amount of \$356,900.00. Richards Powell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

EMS Post 8, located at 501 E 53rd Street North in Park City, was constructed as a combined Fire and EMS Station in 1991. Fire District #1 vacated their portion of the facility in 2008 and the facility is currently operating solely as an EMS Station with six bays, several of those being used to store various Public Safety vehicles.

The EMS Post 8 remodel and building repair project addresses both interior and exterior repairs throughout the building. Exterior work will include a new roof, repair of several leaking clearstory windows, building signage, painting the exterior insulation and finish system (EIFS), washing the exterior building concrete, and correction of drainage issues. Interior work will include modifications to accommodate a 4-person crew per shift, isolated hot water unit, replacement of tube heaters in the ambulance and apparatus bays, remodeled kitchen, and ADA upgrades according to the county's transition plan.

The alternate is to demo the south interior (former fire living quarters) back to exterior walls. This will isolate the utilities and prepare an open area for any future county utilization.
