

Aaron Breitenbach is a Chief Attorney who supervises one of the Office's two General Trial Divisions. He also oversees the Office's review of bond forfeitures and other issues involving the bonding process in the 18th Judicial District. Previously, Mr. Breitenbach was the Chief of the Office's Traffic Division, and he continues to assist in the Office's review and prosecution of traffic-related fatalities and serious injury collisions.

Mr. Breitenbach earned his bachelor of science in Speech and Political Science from Kansas State University in 1998 and his juris doctor from the University of Kansas' School of Law in 2001. He joined the Office in August of that year and has prosecuted a variety of cases in the intervening years, ranging from theft and DUI to rape and murder in the first degree. Mr. Breitenbach is a member of the Wichita Bar Association, serving as the Secretary of its Board of Governors 2019-2020. He also serves on other committees within the Bar, including chairing its Mentoring Committee. Mr. Breitenbach is a member of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association and routinely assists in training prosecutors and law enforcement across the State of Kansas on topics related to DUI and traffic investigations, ethics, and trial advocacy. In addition to his professional associations, Mr. Breitenbach volunteers with the Arthritis Foundation, having previously served on its local, regional, and national boards.
