## Are their shots up-to-date?



**Have your child vaccinated before school starts.**

Vaccinations are available from your medical provider, walk-in clinics, community health clinics, or the **Sedgwick County Health Department** locations shown below. Please bring your child's shot records at the time of vaccination, and plan to share those records with their school.

Prices for immunizations vary. The **Health Department** accepts state and private insurance, as well as self-pay based on a sliding fee scale for uninsured children. Please bring insurance information or proof of current income.

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# Vaccinations required for school entry

Check vaccinations below. Provide your child's shot record to the school before the first day of class.



## Kindergarten - Grade 6

Vaccine	Requirement
DTaP/DT (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis)	5 doses
IPV (polio)	4 doses
MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)	2 doses
Varicella (chickenpox)	2 doses*
Hepatitis B	3 doses
Hepatitis A - <u>New Requirement</u>	2 doses (KDG/ Grade 1)



## Grades 7 - 12

Vaccine	Requirement
Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis)	1 dose
Meningococcal ACWY - <u>New Requirement</u>	2 doses (1 dose 7th grade / 1 dose 11th grade)
IPV (polio)	4 doses
MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)	2 doses
Varicella (chickenpox)	2 doses*
Hepatitis B	3 doses

[ ] Same doses as required for Kindergarten - Grade 6

\*Varicella vaccine is required unless you have a signed doctor's note stating your child had chickenpox.



## Additional recommended vaccines for school age children include:

### 6 months of age and older:

- Annual flu shot (available each October)

### 11 years of age:

- Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) cancer prevention vaccine

### 16 years of age:

- Meningococcal meningitis B vaccine

K.A.R. 28-1-20 defines immunizations required for any person who attends school or a childcare program operated by a school. The usual number of doses required are listed above. However, the number of doses your child needs could be different. If you have questions about your child's vaccination status, contact your child's medical provider or the Sedgwick County Health Department.



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
