#### How to verify a mailing is from the Census Bureau

If you receive a survey or a letter in the mail from the Census Bureau, the envelope contains certain information that will help you verify its legitimacy.



### How to identify a Census Bureau field representative

If you are visited by someone from the Census Bureau, here are some ways to verify the individual is a Census Bureau employee.



#### How to identify a phone call from the Census Bureau

If your address was selected to be in a survey, we may call you to participate.

Aug – Oct 2019 Address Canvassing – select areas

October 2019 Area Census Offices Open

Early 2020 Group Quarters Start

• March 9, 2020 Self Response Starts

April 1, 2020 CENSUS DAY

• May 2020 Non-Response Follow-Up Starts

August 2020 Data Collection Complete

December 31, 2020 Counts Delivered to President

• April 2021 Redistricting counts delivered to states

  - —Education Phase 2018-2019
  - —Awareness Phase January-February 2020
  - —Motivation Phase March May 2020
  - —Reminder Phase May July 2020
  - —Thank You Phase Starts July 2020
  - Local governments and community leaders throughout the nation participate in activities highlighting the message that the 2020 Census is imminent and that it is easy, important and safe to participate





# What does 'Hard To Count' (HTC) mean? Hard to locate-

Transient, homeless, migrants, tiny homes, squatters, not zoned residential, not up to code, unconventional housing, off-the-grid, short term renters, remote structures, multi-unit structures, natural disasters, dense urban areas



#### Hard to contact-

gated communities, undocumented persons, persons experiencing homelessness, institutions, limited connectivity, rarely home

# Hard to persuade-

Too busy, distrustful of government, already filled out a survey, never completed Census before

# Hard to interview-

Language barriers, low literacy, disability

# Hard to classify-

Multiple family households, unrelated households, orphan-headed, shared custody, converted structures





# Will Wichita be in the top 50 cities?

Wichita's estimated 2018 population is 389,255.

We've already surpassed Cleveland in 2015 at 383,793.


We are currently #51 right behind New Orleans with a population of 391,006.

# How will Wichita's urban core continue to revitalize?

- It all starts with having the demographic data to apply for grants, qualify for Opportunity Zones and maintain and attract new business and people.
- The U.S. Census Bureau is the premier collector of information that communities can use to discover and address the needs of the population. Whether it's a summer program for kids or housing rehab, it's having the numbers that count.
- The 2020 decennial Census is coming soon and unlike other surveys, samples or estimates it is an enumeration of the entire populace. Every household needs to participate to be counted correctly. Don't be left out!
- Invitations to respond to the Census will be delivered to households in March 2020.





# Will Sedgwick County Kansas make the 500,000 mark?

Sedgwick County's 2010 Census population count was 498,365.


Several *estimates* show we have surpassed the ½ million mark, but the decennial population count is *not* a survey or a sample, if persons living here on Census Day do not complete their Census forms they could very well not be counted.

That's a mere 1,635 away from being in the top list of county searches for businesses and events and families and non-profits and flights and conventions

and vacations and the list goes on.

Let's not sell ourselves short, Let's make sure everyone is counted!
