On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of Facilities Maintenance, Jennifer Blasi moved to **accept the proposal from Harris' Dream Clean, LLC and establish contract pricing at the rates listed above for one (1) year, with four (4) one year options to renew.** Tim Myers seconded the motion. The vote pasted three to two with Randy Bargdill and Angela Caudillo abstaining from the vote.

A review committee consisting of Sabrina Young - Manager's Office, Joyce Jabara - Family Court Services, Larinda Oxford - District Attoney's Office, Capt. Jared Schechter - Adult Detention Facility, David Perricone - Facilities Maintenance, and Britt Rosencutter - Purchasing evaluated all proposals based on the criteria set forth in the RFP. Two (2) vendors were short-listed, Harris' Dream Clean, LLC and Able Janitorial, Inc. After interviews with both proposers and checking the references provided, the committee unanimously chose Harris' Dream Clean, LLC.

Note:

Harris' Dream Clean, LLC is a locally owned and operated company.

Approximate 2019 annual spend for the Main Courthouse = \$223,732.80. Approximate 2019 annual spend for the Adult Detention Facility = \$13,728.00.

Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: I would ask on this item, Mr. Bargdill, is he okay to vote on this item or should he abstain based on the previous?

Mike Fessinger: Yes, Mr. Bargdill was not on the review panel for these next two items, but he nevertheless analyzed these vendors from the perspective of a review panel analyst. Therefore, even though it's not explicitly stated in Charter 68. It would be my recommendation that he abstains on the next two items.

Russell Leeds: Thank you. With that, questions from the Board on this item? I know you've explained the rationale behind the conclusion on the first one, similar conclusion on this one, this one pricing slightly different? Able coming in slightly higher than the last one. The overall pricing is slightly higher on this one, could you speak to the rationale of this panel who analyzed for their choice?

David Perricone: I can tell you during the committee meetings price was very far down the list for actual priorities. I think in the scoring it was five points. We didn't discuss pricing much at all. Able seemed more in line with the average of all the other bids. Harris' was by far the lowest for this one, but again that wasn't really taken into consideration during our meetings. Other than the objective scoring that we always do.

Russell Leeds: Based on the overall scoring, the scoring came out in favor of Harris'?

David Perricone: Yes.
