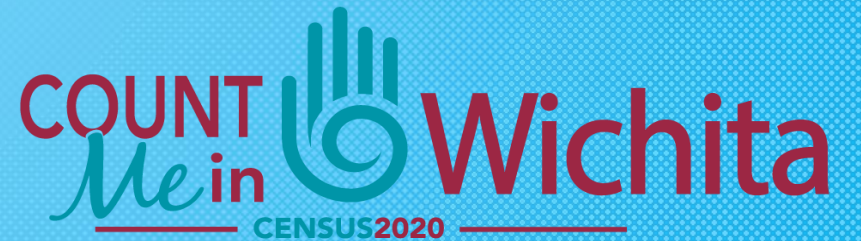


Census 2020



**Your Census data is confidential.
By law, it cannot be shared with
immigration or law enforcement
agencies or used to determine
eligibility for government
assistance programs.**

The Census will never ask for:
your social security number,
money or donations, anything on
behalf of a political party, or your
bank or credit card numbers.

Census results determine how and where federal funding is distributed, including housing vouchers, Headstart early education, Title 1, Medicaid, food stamps, lunch programs and public libraries.

Currently, Wichita is the

being in the top 50!

Count All Kids estimates that Kansas undercounted 4,465 children under age five in the 2010 Census.

This netted a loss of more than \$4,500,000 per year for more than 300 programs funded using Census data.

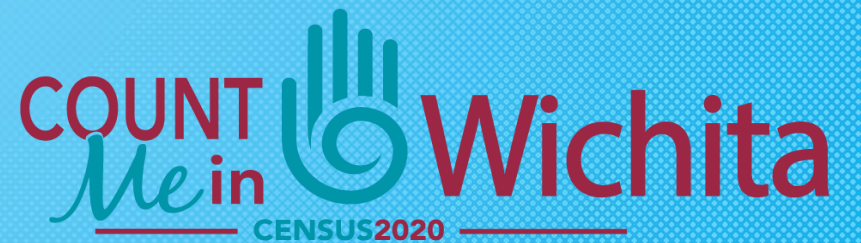
Unlike voting, which excludes people age 17 and younger, non-citizens and individuals that are or have been incarcerated, the Census counts everyone.

is required by law.

Title 13, U.S. Code, Sections 141 and 193

Common populations underreported by the Census include: children age five and younger, LGBTQ, people of color, immigrants, people experiencing homelessness, renters, people living in rural areas, low-income households, single-parent families and people with limited English-language proficiency.

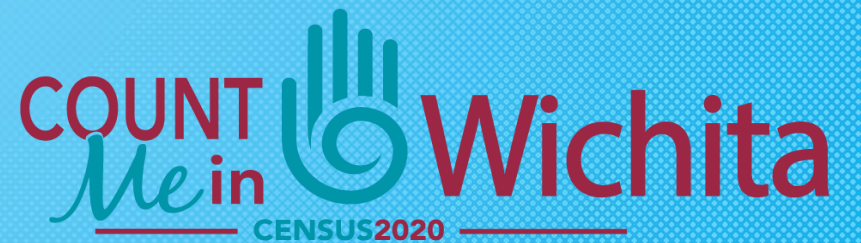
Title 13 of the U.S. Code protects the confidentiality of personally identifiable information provided in Census responses, including citizenship status.

This year, most people will take the Census online. The online form will be available in 13 languages, including Arabic, Chinese, English, French and Spanish. It's been optimized for smartphones and tablets.

All Census personnel will be easily identifiable with a badge and a Census bag.

The number of congressional seats and Electoral College votes each state gets are determined by Census numbers.

The Census Bureau respects how someone self-identifies in terms of gender and doesn't cross-check information given with any other source.

The 2020 Census will allow people to self-identify their race and ethnicity through a combination of checkboxes with nationalities and write-in spaces to report any other origins or subgroups.

Data from the Census is used by business to determine, for example, where to build new supermarkets, and by emergency responders to locate injured people after natural disasters.

Census data reflects the growth of the population as well as the changing values and interests of the American people.
